AXENE ENJOYS SUPER 16 WEEKEND . . .

becoming Youngest ever SAMA Winner
at the MTN SAMA 16 Awards

Young singing star AXENE enjoyed a super successful weekend at the glamorous 16th annual MTN SAMA Awards held at Sun City becoming the youngest-ever winner of a SAMA award.



For AXENE the weekend kicked off on Friday 16th April with a dynamic live on-stage performance at the Gala Function, duetting with popular Loyiso Bala singing his mega-hit 'Maybe', and catching the attention and admiration of the critical industry audience with her energetic and professional performance.

As AXENE arrived for the glitzy Saturday night main SAMA 16 event, she caught the eye of everyone with her stunning black and white dress from 'Elegance After Dark' as she moved down the yellow celebrity carpet.

Television crews and photographers alike all moved in to get a piece of the action as AXENE smiled and charmed her way through more than 16 TV interviews. The spectacular live SAMA 16 event, which was broadcast live nationwide on TV1 (and simulcast live on the internet for the first time ever), provided AXENE with another great opportunity to be seen throughout SA, as she co-presented the 'Best Kwaito Album' award with hip-hop superstar Da L.E.S.
